Best Ever Exam Results

Welcome to the first newsletter of the 2018 -19 session. Our students got us off to an outstanding start by achieving the best results in SQA examinations in the history of the school.

33% of last session's S4 students achieved 5 or more passes at National 5, placing them in a good position for S5 work. For the S5 students, 66% gained one or more Highers or equivalent, 51% gained 3 or more Highers or equivalent and 33% achieved 5 or more Highers or equivalent. In Advanced Highers, 18% gained one or more passes.

Congratulations go to all students on their success, all of which was achieved through hard work and perseverance throughout the year.
