SQA Examinations

S4 – S6 students are now in the final lead up to their SQA examinations. It is therefore vital that they make the most of the Easter break and use this time to study hard. A large number of Easter Study classes will be running in school and students have been issued with a copy of the Easter School timetable. Copies are also uploaded in the School Information section at the top of the webpage under Student Information and details are also contained on the school app. I would urge students to make full use of these classes, but also ask that parents and carers encourage their children to follow this up with plenty of revision at home too. Former Students Promote STEM

Former Deans Community High School students Mark Lang and Cory Dunnigan returned to the Science Department on Thursday to speak with students about the importance of the STEM subjects and how these subjects have shaped their careers. Mark is now a Naval Engineer, in charge of weapons systems, and Cory is now a Junior Doctor. Both studied the Sciences and Mathematics at Deans until they left in 2011 and they discussed how the skills and knowledge they learned at school through these subjects, had set them on the path to their current careers.



Students from S2, S3 and senior students were given time to listen and ask questions on Mark and Cory's personal experiences of STEM subjects and how these subject have contributed to their success in their careers. Students were very appreciative of their advice and guidance especially at a time of course choice for S2 and S3, with many senior students considering their future careers.



S5 Students Experience Mock Interviews

All S5 students were given the opportunity to further develop their employability skills through Mock Interviews.

Deans welcomed 16 Business Representatives from a range of local companies into the school to conduct the mock interviews.

Students were asked 3 interview questions and provided with written feedback on their answers as well as tips for future interviews. Well done to all of the students who were interviewed and a big thank you to the Business Representatives for their support.









STEM Assemblies for S2 Students

Members of our community from STEM-related jobs recently presented to our S2 students in the theatre. The purpose of the assembly was to make students aware of STEM and how STEM-related subjects can help their educational progression through the use of speakers talking directly about their own experiences. There is a STEM employment growth which will continue for the next 10 years. This means there are more opportunities for students progressing through the modern apprenticeships, College and University route to fill these spaces. There is also a major uneven gender balance in these jobs where females make up a very small percentage.

It is now official: Literacy is fun!

The students in the photograph below attend Deans Community High School EAL (English as an Additional Language) Base on Friday mornings. Ms. Montgomery delivers ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) as part of a partnership programme with West Lothian College and EAL students from all over the county study for SQA qualifications designed to improve Reading, Writing, Talking and Listening, reinforcing literacy across all areas of the secondary curriculum and helping to ensure more positive destinations after leaving school.

The course is delivered to students working at a variety of different levels through a number of different learning and teaching styles, with students evidencing great success as they move between school and college in classes at Early Literacies stage and then into Nationals 2, 3, 4, 5 and Higher.

The photograph demonstrates great teamworking as students take time out from textbook lessons to put into practice their understanding of Prepositions such as in, out, around, through, over, under, behind, in front of ... all consolidated within the context of playing football.

EAL students are fully integrated into the ESOL lessons and over time learn the skills of working together to forge friendships with those from other schools and other nationalities and quite importantly, becoming tolerant and accepting of working collaboratively within mixed group/teams. The sharing of expressions in different languages and the laughter and appreciation of goals scored (sometimes in the wrong net) make this particular activity a thoroughly enjoyable way to learn.


