

Examination Results

Welcome to the first newsletter of the 2019-20 session. Our students got us off to an outstanding start by once again achieving a wonderful set of examination results. 36% of last session's S4 students achieved 5 or more passes at National 5, placing them in a good position for S5 work. For the S5 students, 67% gained one or more Highers or equivalent, 51% gained 3 or more Highers or equivalent and 34% achieved 5 or more Highers or equivalent. In Advanced Highers, 17% gained one or more pass. Congratulations go to all students on their success, all of which was achieved through hard work and perseverance throughout the year.

The students who attended really enjoyed their day and as this event took place on a school holiday they should be praised for their dedication.


