Future Asset Roadshow - West Lothian College

Future Asset is a charity which runs workshops for girls across Scotland introducing them to investment and highlighting possible future careers in asset management and the financial industry.

Four senior girls attended the roadshow at West Lothian College where they worked with investment professionals to manage a portfolio, in the Future Asset Investment Game, choosing where to invest their clients' money. The girls worked in teams developing their interpersonal skills, problem solving skills and resilience.





SKY ADA Lovelace Day

Six of our S2/S3 girls attended the Ada Lovelace Day run by Sky in Livingston. They took part in workshops focussing on Robotics and Website Design. The girls worked in groups with students from other school in West Lothian, generating ideas for a client in order to create a user interface.

The girls thoroughly enjoyed their experience with sky, developing creativity, coding, evaluating, problem solving and IT skills and finding out about new career possibilities.





S1 STEM Project

Eight S1 students took part in a STEM project over a period of 6 weeks at Craigshill Library. During this time the students carried out a number of projects including building and coding a robot in order to perform a number of tasks.

Students used a 3D pen and 3D printer, designing and creating a number of items including a pair of glasses and a replica of the old style handheld games console.

The Royal Navy

The Royal Navy met with the 'Subs in Schools' students who are taking part in a competition to create an underwater vessel.

During the visit they discussed hydrodynamics and answered questions the students had about the tasks involved. The competition is in April at Faslane.

The Royal Navy also spent the afternoon with 40 students from S1 looking at coding and robotics. The students demonstrated their problem solving and creativity skills while completing a number of coding tasks with the robots.



PWC Experience

Five senior students attended a coaching day with PWC at their offices in Edinburgh. The students took part in a Dragon's Den style activity building communication, problem solving and creativity skills, while developing their idea for a school initiative.

PWC provided students with information on their STEM, Technology and Business careers as well as highlighting the apprenticeship programmes they run with The University of Edinburgh.



Historic Scotland Event

Twenty five students in S2 attended the Historic Environment Scotland Careers Event in Linlithgow, showcasing careers within the Tourism, Culture and Heritage sectors.

The event was interactive and provided students with the opportunity to learn about various job roles from archaeologists and historians to stonemasons, visitor service staff and education officers.



Science Career Talk

Dr Scott Paterson from Bristol University gave an interactive and informative presentation on different career opportunities for Science students.

Dr Paterson shared with us his progression pathway and the types of things undertakes as part of his day-to-day job.

Career Ready students have continued to engage with the Career Ready Masterclasses and build relationships with mentors. We welcomed parents and our mentors into the school network. celebrate to the success of the summer internships and discuss the focus for the year ahead.

Smart STEM

In December a group of S1 girls attended a 'Smart STEM' event at West Lothian College which was run by The Sky Academy.

The focus of the event was 'Women in Technology' where the students developed their leadership and communication skills throughout the day while engaging in a variety of workshops.

They also got to direct and record an advert which was showcased at the end of the day.

Algebra Tiles Project in Maths



Deans Maths Department are one of 20 schools across the Forth Valley and West Lothian Regional Improvement Collaborative (RIC) who are undertaking an improvement project 'Highly Impactful Teaching at National 5'.

Part of the training involves the use of 'Algebra Tiles' which are proven to develop students conceptual understanding of negative numbers and early algebra work.

Mr Duncan, who is the lead PTC on the project said "there is no doubt that this training has had a positive impact on our student's, not only with the targeted S3 group but also with the S1 and S2 we have taught using these strategies. If students can master negative numbers and algebraic terms it puts them in a really strong position to build on that understanding in National 5 Algebra"

The project group are also working with the Children's and Young People's Improvement Collaborative to look at ways of tracking and implementing the training long term.
