P7 – S1 Transition

We have been delighted that the easing of some restrictions have allowed us to begin welcoming P7 students into the school building this week. As always, we have begun with short visits for students who benefit from enhanced transition, giving them an opportunity to have a tour of the building and meet some of the support team. The main visits for all of our new students will take place between Monday 14th June and Thursday 17th June, with each student having a day at Deans. Although the Covid restrictions prevent us from placing students in their S1 classes on these days, we hope that the activities we have planned will give them a sense of what to expect when they start in August.

Change of Timetable

Students will move onto their new timetables from Monday 14th June.

LFD Testing

It was very welcome news that West Lothian moves into level 1 from 5th June, giving us all some hope for normality in the near future. Scottish Government are still encouraging secondary staff and students to do twice weekly testing for Covid at home using the LFD testing kits. From my own perspective, I get a lot of reassurance from using these, particularly as I start to visit friends and family again. We still have plenty of the kits here at the school for students to take home to use and these can be collected from the school reception during Tutor periods each day. Reminder of Covid 19 Protocols

As you are aware, with the return of our pupils and staff to school, we have put procedures in to place that support all members of the school community if anyone displays symptoms of Covid 19.

A reminder that the symptoms are:

- High temperature or fever
- A new continuous cough
- A loss of, or change in sense of smell or taste

If a pupil displays symptoms, we will contact you to collect your child (please ensure that we have your most up to date contact details). Pupils over the age of 16 may return home themselves. The pupil should, if possible, wear a face covering en route and avoid public transport.

You will be asked to follow Test and Protect and we will provide you with a copy of the Test and Protect Leaflet and Step by Step Guide when your child is collected.

Information on the groups of children within the school, and on school transport, and the adults that each group of children come in to contact with will be collected. This is to fulfil legal responsibilities for public health and will allow Test and Protect to contact appropriate people in the event of a positive test result.

If anyone within your household tests positive for Covid 19, please do not send your child to school. Report their absence and the reason for this by calling PSA in the morning.
