## Lunch Breaks

We have been running with two separate lunch sessions and a staggered finish for students since schools re-opened in August 2020 after the first lockdown. I am delighted to say that the updated guidance from Scottish Government now allows us to go back to having a single lunchbreak for all students. We also no longer require staggered finish times, meaning that **all students** will finish at **3.30 pm Monday to Thursday** and at **12.20 pm on a Friday**. These changes will take place **after the Easter break** and the school day from Monday to Thursday will run as follows:

8.35 am – 9.25 am	Period 1

### **Reminder of Covid 19 Protocols**

As you are aware, with the return of our pupils and staff to school, we have put procedures in place that support all members of the school community if anyone displays symptoms of Covid 19.
