Throughout the school year we evaluate the effectiveness of our work in supporting our young people. We try to do this in a number of ways, including pupil/staff/parent/partner focus groups, discussion at Parent Council and Student Council, surveys and tracking of student progress. As we come to the end of the school year, we use the evaluations to identify and plan improvements for the following year as well as identifying longer term aims.

Our school ethos plays a very large part in how our students develop physically, emotionally and academically, and evaluating our school ethos is in part done by asking parents and carers to complete an annual ethos survey. This is led by West Lothian Council and the results are used by both the school and wider education service to make improvements.
